Hope to see you at club this month...and thanks for showing up this past year. All of your efforts have been greatly appreciated!

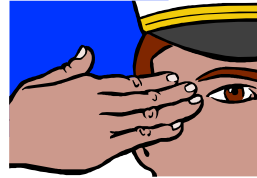
