First of all, we continue to get thanks for all the birthday gifts you are providing for foster kids. Whenever possible, we try to get ideas for you of either items the child wants or what their interests are. We know it is helpful when you are out shopping for the gifts. Many of you have had some specific questions which I thought would be helpful to answer here.

What do I put on the gift? Due to confidentiality issues the Children's Services only gives the child's gender, the date of birth and the child's initials. What is most helpful is for you to include a birthday card or tag with the gift. Sign your name to the card. They know that you are a member of the Soroptimists. Then on a separate piece of paper attached with a paperclip, write the child's information (i.e. date of birth, gender and initials).

Where do we deliver gifts? Karen Bednarski has offered to be the collection point person this year. So if you can deliver the gift to her at the courthouse, she will see that it gets to the Children's Services.
