Per requests for the recipe for Diane's Broccoli Salad, here it is:

- 2 large bunches of broccoli, chopped
- 1/3 red onion, chopped
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 jar real bacon bits or 1/2 lb of bacon, cooked and crumbled.
- 2 cups whole cashews

Dressing:

- 1 cup Mayo (not Miracle Whip)
- 2 Tbls lemon juice
- 3 Tbsp sugar

Chop broccoli into small bite-size pierces. Add remaining ingredients **except cashews**. Blend dressing ingredients and pour over salad, mix well and chill several hours or overnight. Just before serving add cashews.
